Ending homelessness in Regina will require the energy, resources, and commitment of a whole community.¹

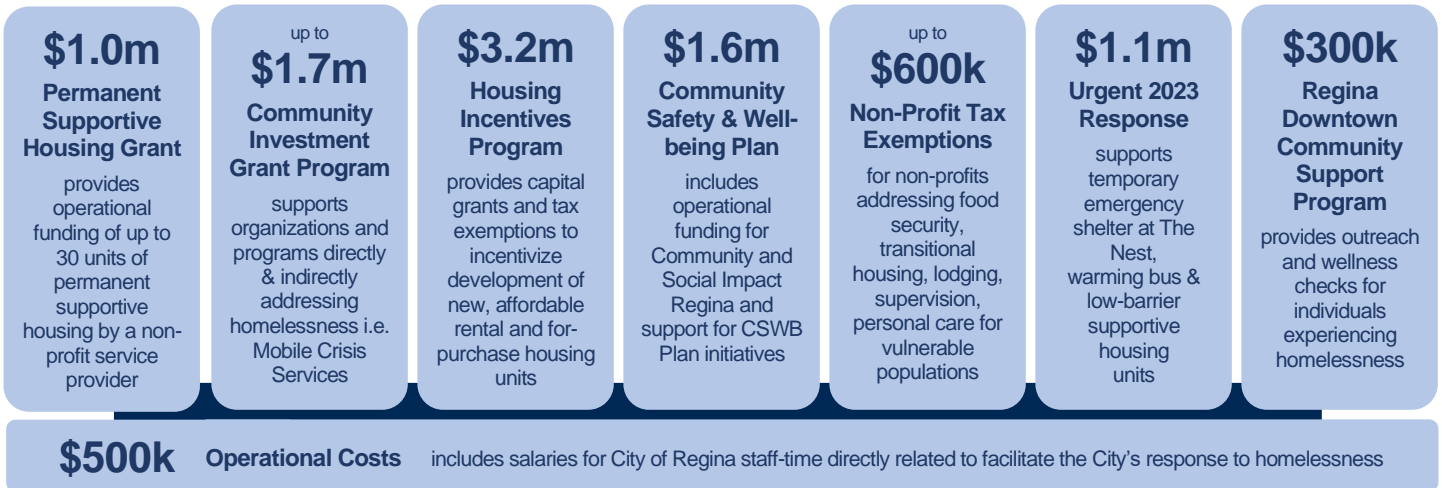
Action involves addressing structural and systemic factors that contribute to and perpetuate homelessness, in addition to responding to individual factors, such as mental health and addictions.¹

Five protective factors help mitigate the risk of homelessness:

- ① Healthy social relationships
- ② Cultural supports
- ③ Education
- ④ Access to affordable housing
- ⑤ Adequate income.¹
